



2021/2022 Victims Services Funding

Safe Space Sussex Funding Network

The Police and Crime Commissioner holds a statutory responsibility to commission local victim and witness support services and receives a grant direct from the Ministry of Justice to do so.

The Safe Space Sussex Funding Network was designed to ensure the services the Commissioner commissions for victims and witnesses of crime are the best they can be as promised in the Police and Crime Plan. All providers must be approved through a quality assurance process before they are able to receive funding.

Occasionally the Commissioner will release a competitive funding tranche for one off grant funds to increase capacity or allow organisations to start innovative projects. The funding tranche for 2021/2022 was opened for providers to bid into on 11th December 2020 and closed on the 22nd February 2021.

After an assessment procedure took place, the following projects were marked as successful and awarded funding:
